

# Salisbury Primary School – School Uniform / PE Kit Policy

## **Introduction**

It is our policy that all children should wear clothing that is in keeping with a purposeful learning ethos. WE also believe it is important that certain activities are facilitated by specialised and appropriate clothing when attending school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours. We provide a complete list of the items needed for children's school uniform in this policy.

## **Aims**

Our policy for children's school uniform is that a school uniform promotes a sense of pride in the school, engenders a feeling of community and belonging, is practical and smart, identifies the children with the school, is not distracting in class (as fashion clothes might be), makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance, is regarded as suitable, is good value for money, and has been designed with health and safety in mind. Children are expected to wear their school uniform both in school and, when required, on educational visits.

## **School Uniform**

<b>All pupils</b>
Grey/black skirt or trousers White polo shirt Navy blue jumper or cardigan White and navy blue checked summer dress  Footwear should be black/dark shoes with a reasonable heel (not trainers)

## **PE Kit**

<b>Indoor</b>	<b>Outdoor</b>	<b>Swimming</b>
Black shorts and white t-shirt Pumps (indoor)	Indoor kit plus track suit Trainers (outdoor)	Swimming costume (girls) Swimming trunks (boys) Swimming cap Towel

All items of clothing should be clearly labelled with the child's name.

Jewellery should be restricted to a watch and one pair of stud earrings only (which **MUST** be removed for PE activities). Religious jewellery and head scarves may be worn but **MUST** be removed for PE activities due to health and safety reasons. If children do wear head scarves, we encourage families to buy these in school colours.

Children should not come in to school wearing make-up or cosmetics (including false nails or nail varnish).
