Dear Parents/Carers,

Hope you all had a good break. With just a few weeks remaining before the spring term ends, we reach an important time to reflect on achievements so far and what we need to focus on over the remainder of the academic year.

I would like to begin by thanking you for supporting our Number Day event, which raised an incredible  $\pounds$ 368 for the NSPCC. The children had a great day taking part in the exciting mathematical and orienteering activities that we had planned for them.

Our children in Year 6 have been preparing for their end of Key Stage 2 SATs so are well into their revision programmes. The tests take place in May, week beginning 13/05/25. We will provide some further information closer to the date.

Opportunities for our children to experience learning in different ways is very much part of our approach to the wider curriculum, so trips/visits are being organised by staff to ensure children are able to take full advantage of what is on offer. The boxing enrichment days were an absolute hit with the children and we intend to offer a few more similar things, later in the year.

We continue to promote the importance of healthy lifestyles and active learning with sports coaches supplementing lunchtime activities for the children. The coaches always try to engage as many children as they can with a range of fun, multi-sport activities.

You will also see that we have a number of events coming up, greatly enjoyed by all – World Book day is one such occasion when the children can dress-up to represent their favourite book characters and participate in reading activities with a difference.

We have British Science Week coming up soon, when everyone is involved in specialised scientific learning – it is usually a great fun week for all! This year we are also planning a science exhibition. We will let you know of the details of this in the next few weeks.

At the end of this term, we will be providing a mid-year progress report for your child. It will help you understand how well your child is doing and give you an indication of aspects they need to work on over the next few months. Further to you receiving the progress update, staff will follow up any queries you may have and should you require a follow-up conversation then please arrange with your child's teacher, through class dojo.
